

A VIEW FROM THE PEW: In 1947 the church of St Wulstan was invited by the BBC to present the Evening Service. For us Catholics, this meant 'Benediction', a much-loved part of Sunday for many of us. Some of the rehearsals were held in choir members' houses. My father was a member of the choir, so one evening in May, it was our turn. (I think a hotpot supper was also provided!) I was sent to bed early (school next day) and as I climbed the stairs, I paused to listen to the music, stirred by its beauty. It was Mozart's 'Ave Verum'. The next morning my father set off early on his bike to catch the tide. (He was the engineer on the dredger S.D. Poulton.) As he reached his ship, he collapsed and died of a heart attack. My final memory of a beloved father is therefore bound up with this beautiful motet. Later, when I discovered the meaning of the Latin words, it has grown in greater significance for me. Jesus, through his suffering on the cross, has left us with a living and eternal assurance of His real presence through the Holy Eucharist and as a foretaste of the great feast to come.
